The first half of the semester will consist of a series of professional development workshops. In addition, students will conduct job related research and make formal presentations on current issues and trends affecting their profession. The course also provides an introduction on small business development. During the second half of the semester students will complete a seven-week internship.

 - 4.4 Arrange and complete an interview for internship.
- 5. Complete seven-week internship.**
 - 5.1 Plan and complete a seven-week internship.
 - 5.2 Adhere to internship learning objectives.
 - 5.3 Submit weekly journals.
 - 5.4 Advise program faculty advisor and internship supervisor of any problems associated with internship.
 - 5.5 Demonstrate professional behaviour during internship.
